## **Finding Value**

Weight is a crucial factor when determining livestock prices. There are several types of weighing conditions producers can use when marketing cattle. Cattle sold with an overnight stand may bring more per hundred weight than cattle coming off the bunk. To potentially maximize your prices, sellers may consider bringing fed cattle to the auction market one night before the sale. This allows the livestock to reduce some amount of feed in their system and gives buyers additional

confidence in the pounds they are bidding up on sale day.

Another important factor in increasing buyer interest is to become BQA certified. BQA certification educates beef producers on best management practices. Topics include cattle handling, record keeping, herd health, biosecurity, and transportation to name a few. Certification will not only help you make the best management decisions for your operation, but also help buyers gain confidence in your cattle. Certification can be done online or through local in-person events and must be renewed every three years. For more information on becoming BQA certified, visit www.bga.org.

## Equity Attends 2024 National Council of Farmer Cooperatives Conference

February 13th through the 15th, the National Council of Farmer Cooperatives (NCFC) hosted its 95th Annual Meeting in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. This conference provides a fantastic opportunity for Equity's farmer regional directors to engage with the issues that are at the core of the work NCFC does in Washington.

The conference this year revolved around the theme "The Next Generation of Co-op Boards: Evolving for the Future." The meeting kicked off on Tuesday, February 13th, with a joint session with the Public Policy Conference including discussions on; Agriculture & the Rural Economy: A View from the Administration, Finding Partnerships in a Chaotic Political Environment, Using Your Voice in the Upcoming Tax Debate, and Director Education: Engaging with Millennials and Gen Z Consumer Panel. On Wednesday, February 14th, our regional directors participated in director education sessions on navigating the board's role on social issues and the importance and value of board assessments and generating successful outcomes from such assessments. The conference wrapped up on Thursday, February 15th with continued director education on success in the board room from the CEO's perspective and the panel consisted of recently retired farmer co-op CEOs reflecting on their experiences with boards and discussing the elements they believe create a high-functioning board and a powerful board-management relationship.
